THE SCHOOL FOR ETHICS AND GLOBAL LEADERSHIP (SEGL) ANNOUNCES RESIDENTIAL FACILITY



Washington, DC (June 29, 2009): The School for Ethics and Global Leadership (SEGL), a new DC-based program designed to educate leaders of the future, announced today the signing of its residential facility lease.

The Residential Facility

SEGL's residential facility is a spacious three-level brick townhouse located on Capitol Hill just one block from the Supreme Court and Senate Office Buildings and only a few blocks from Union Station and the Metro. The neighborhood is safe and secure, with several members of Congress living nearby when Congress is in session.

SEGL students will live in furnished rooms above a basement apartment that houses faculty supervisors. The townhouse also has a kitchen, washer/dryers, internet access, and several common spaces. The building is owned and maintained by the Washington Internship Student Housing (WISH) program. WISH is a well-respected organization with a long track record of serving elite high school and college students from across the United States.

"Housing SEGL students on Capitol Hill means that SEGL is now structured to provide the full Washington, DC experience," said SEGL Board Chair J. Matteson Ellis. "While students study alongside the Executive Branch and embassy community in Dupont Circle, they will live at the steps of the Legislative and Judicial Branches of our federal government. No Washington, DC program could be more complete." "I couldn't be happier with this promising partnership," said SEGL Director Noah Bopp. "WISH takes the guesswork out of student housing, allowing us to focus on creating a top-notch academic community."
